Today's lessons:

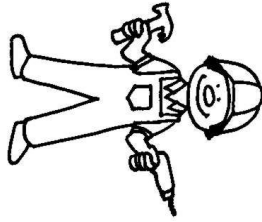
- Ruth 3:1–5; 4:13–17 Naomi has lost her husband, and now both her sons have died, too. All she has left is her daughter-in-law Ruth who takes care of her like a real daughter. In turn, Naomi makes sure that Ruth gets a good husband. And so Ruth becomes the great-grandmother of King David...
- Psalm 127 Even what we see as our very own achievements – like our home and our family – is ours only because God gives it to us and continues to protect it.
- Hebrews 9:24–28 Jesus Christ gave himself as a sacrifice for our sin, once for all. But his work is only completed once he has saved all who wait for him.
- Mark 12:38–44 According to Jesus, the poor widow, putting a penny in the offering, is a greater giver than rich people who give large amounts of money.

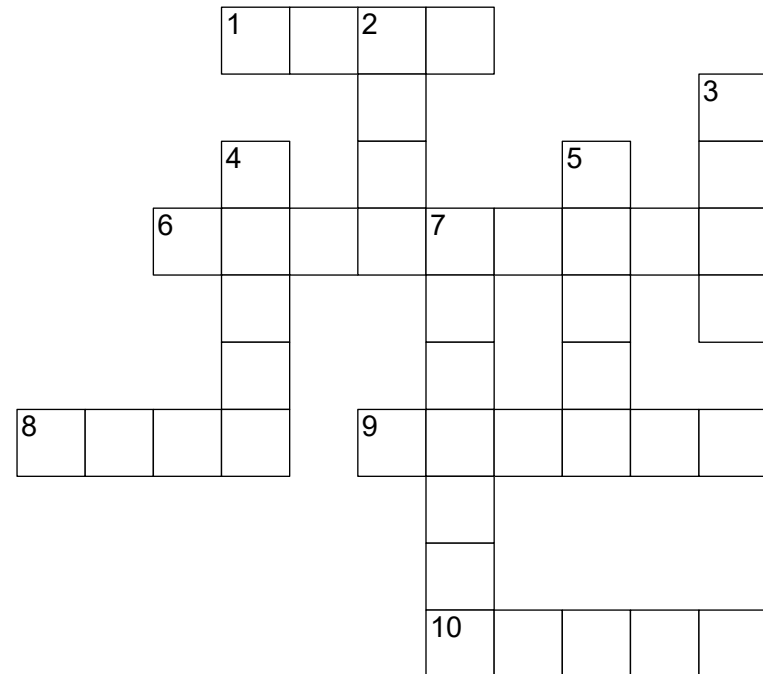
